MEETING MINUTES
REPUBLICAN LEGISLATIVE DISTRICT 11
JUNE 13, 2006

On June 13, 2006, Chairman Haney called the Republican Legislative District 11 meeting to order at 7:00 p.m. The meeting was held at the Arizona-American Italian Club, 7509 N. 12th Street, Phoenix, AZ.

The invocation was given by Rev. Wes Darby. The Pledge of Allegiance to the Flag of the United States of America was led by Bill Keller.

Chairman Haney introduced guests, candidates and elected officials.

Senator Leff said the legislature is at a standstill. She said the reason Governor Napolitano vetoed SN-1157 was because employee sanctions weren't strong enough. Representative Allen thanked PC's for submitting petitions and thinks that Governor Napolitano will veto the state budget.

Treasurer Teegarden presented an audio recording by David Barton on politics and the church. Mr. Barton has the largest private collection of original documents written by the Founding Fathers.

First Vice-Chairman John Acer introduced guest speaker Chris Simcox, Founder of Minuteman Civil Defense Corps. and owner of Tombstone Tumbleweed newspaper. Mr. Simcox organized Minutemen five years ago as a neighborhood citizen watchdog type organization after witnessing foreign nationals crossing the Mexican border into Organ Pipe Cactus National Monument. Foreign nationals are entering the United States from Mexico and Canada. Citizens should hold their elected officials responsible for this unchecked invasion of the United States. Thirty-six thousand border patrol agents are needed to protect United States borders.

Chairman Haney said funds can be raised for the district by purchasing McCain NO for President buttons at \$2.00 each. Rev. Wes Darby donated U.S. Constitution booklets to the district to be purchased at \$2.00 each.

Chairman Haney announced: (1) a quorum was present at the meeting with 65 PC's present, (2) May 8th meeting minutes were approved as distributed, (3) the district will receive \$2.00 for each voter registration, (4) a District 11 candidate forum will be held at July's meeting, and (5) during the November-December meetings PC's can pay a voluntary fee of \$11.00 to help defray the districts expenses. Treasurer's Report is posted on the website.

Randy Pullen announced approximately 13,000 signatures have been collected for the Protect Our City Initiative. Election for this initiative will be held either in November, 2006, or March, 2007.
