MEETING MINUTES
REPUBLICAN LEGISLATIVE DISTRICT 11
AUGUST 8, 2006

On August 8, 2006, Chairman Haney called the Republican Legislative District 11 meeting to order at 7:00 p.m. The meeting was held at the Arizona-American Italian Club, 7509 N. 12th Street, Phoenix, AZ.

The invocation was given by Rep. John Allen. The Pledge of Allegiance to the Flag of the United States of America was led by Michael Clancy.

Chairman Haney introduced guests, candidates and elected officials. Due to the Primary Election being held on September 12th, Chairman Haney announced that the next district meeting will be held September 5th at the Arizona-American Italian Club. The guest speaker at the September 5th meeting will be Alan Korwin of Gun Laws. He introduced Kara Karlson, Arizona Republican Party Field Representative, who discussed the Party's Operation Groundswell program for this year's election. Ms. Karlson said the party will now pay \$10.00 for each new voter registration. Don Hesselbrock, 2nd Vice-Chairman, gave a report on the August EGC meeting: (1) due to a new law requiring auditing of election results, 72 workers are needed from both the Republican and Democratic parties to help hand count ballots from selected precincts; (2) Don Goldwater will be turning in his Clean Elections \$5.00 contributions next week; (3) poll runners and observers are needed; (4) Helen Purcell will provide a letter explaining the polling place 75-ft limit; and (5) Primary voter registrations are due August 14th.

Randy Pullen, National Committeeman, said 684 signatures are need for his Protect Our City initiative. He will be turning in 550 good signatures Thursday, and the decision hasn't been made whether the initiative will be on the November ballot or on the city election in March, 2007. Mr. Pullen said a Resolution Supporting Securing Our Borders as Part of Immigration Reform was passed at the RNC meeting on August 3, 2006. He spoke on the RNC's program for re-electing Republicans to the Senate and House. President Bush has raised more money than ever before. In Arizona the Demoratic Party has targeted CD/8 with \$1.6M and CD/5 with \$1.5M.

A quorum was not present so the June 13th and July 11th meeting minutes will be presented at the September meeting. The Treasurer's Report is posted on the district's website.
