# A Parliamentary Moment

## Incidental Motions Continued

Last month nine *incidental motions* were described. The remaining six more will be described now. An *incidental motion*, you remember, relates to a particular characteristic present in the motion to which it is incidental, or to a particular point in time, or to an occurrence during debate. Most such motions are not debatable.

10. **Request to be Excused From a Duty:** Membership in an organization may impose upon a person an obligation to attend a certain number of meetings, perform relevant duties such as to pay dues, serve on committees, prepare reports, accept office if elected, etc. A member cannot decline such a duty or to demand to be relieved from it, but can request this from the assembly. Such request can be granted by unanimous consent, or a motion to that effect, which is debatable and amendable, can be offered and requires a majority vote.
11. **Parliamentary Inquiry:** This is a question directed to the chair to obtain information on a matter of parliamentary law or the rules of the organization bearing on the matter at hand. It is the chair's duty to answer such questions when it may assist a member to make an appropriate motion, raise a proper point of order, or understand the parliamentary situation or the effect of a motion.
12. **Point of Information:** This is a request directed to the chair, or through the chair to another officer or member, for information relevant to the business at hand but not related to parliamentary procedure.
13. **Request for Permission to Withdraw or Modify a Motion:** Before a motion is stated by the chair, it is the property of the mover, who can withdraw or modify it without asking the consent of anyone. But after the chair has stated a motion, it belongs to the assembly as a whole, and the maker must request the assembly's permission to withdraw or modify his own motion. Such a request can be made at any time before voting on the question has begun. There are some technical aspects to this matter of the maker of a motion modifying his motion in contrast to the procedure of amending the motion.
14. **Request to Read Papers:** If any member objects, a member has no right to read from, or to have the secretary read from, any paper or book as a part of his speech without the permission of the assembly. However, it is customary to permit the reading of short, pertinent printed extracts in debate so long as the privilege is not abused. But whenever a paper or document is before an assembly for action, it is the right for every member that it be read once, and again if amended, before voting on it. Essentially, the assembly's permission must be obtained in order to read extensively as a means of delaying action.
15. **Request for Any Other Privilege:** When a member desires to make a request other than as above—as, for example, a request to address remarks or make a presentation while no motion is pending—he arises, addresses the chair, and, without interrupting

another member states his request. Generally, such matters are settled by unanimous consent or informally, but if there is an objection, a motion can be made to grant the request.
