**A Category of Motions**

**A. Main Motion** A main motion is a motion whose introduction brings business before an assembly.

**B. Subsidiary Motions** Subsidiary motions assist the assembly in treating or disposing of a main motion (and sometimes other motions.)

1. Postpone Indefinitely
2. Amend
3. Commit or Refer
4. Postpone to a Certain Time
5. Limit or Extend Limits of Debate
6. Previous Question
7. Lay on the Table

**C. Privileged Motions** Unlike subsidiary motions, privileged motions do not relate to the pending business, but have to do with special matters of immediate and overriding importance which, without debate, should be allowed to interrupt the consideration of anything else.

1. Calls for the Orders of the Day
2. Raise a Question of Privilege
3. Recess
4. Adjourn
5. Fix the Time to Which to Adjourn

**D. Incidental Motions** Incidental motions relate, in different ways, to the pending business or to business otherwise at hand.

1. Point of Order
2. Appeal
3. Suspend the Rules
4. Objection to the Consideration of a Question
5. Division of a Question
6. Consideration by Paragraph
7. Division of the Assembly
8. Motions relating to Methods of Voting and the Polls
9. Motions Relating to Nominations
10. Request to Be Excused from a Duty
11. Requests and Inquiries
  - a. Parliamentary Inquiry
  - b. Point of Information
  - c. Request for Permission to Withdraw or Modify a Motion
  - d. Request to Read Papers
  - e. Request for Any Other Privilege

### **E. Motions That Bring a Question Again Before the Assembly**

1. Take from the Table
2. Rescind/Amend Something Previously Adopted
3. Discharge a Committee
4. Reconsider

In previous Parliamentary Moments I have written about the Main Motion and Subsidiary Motions.
